Recipe of the Month

Corned Beef Casserole

8-oz pkg macaroni or noodles
12-oz can corned beef
¼ lb American cheese, cut up
1 can cream of chicken or cream of mushroom soup
1 c milk
½ c minced onion
Buttered crumbs for topping

Cook macaroni or noodles and drain. Cut up corned beef and cheese. Mix soup with milk. Combine all ingredients, leaving onion raw. Turn into buttered 2-quart casserole. Top with buttered crumbs. Bake one hour at 350°

Baked Pears with Cinnamon Crème Sauce

4 small pears
2 tbsp firmly-packed brown sugar (or sweetener equivalent to 6 tsp brown sugar)
½ c water
1 tbsp lemon juice
¼ tsp ground cinnamon

Crème Sauce

½ c plain low-fat yogurt
½ tsp ground cinnamon
½ tsp vanilla extract
1 tbsp firmly-packed brown sugar (or sweetener equivalent to 3 tsp brown sugar)

Prepare crème sauce ahead of time. In a small bowl, combine all ingredients in crème sauce. Chill to blend flavors.

Preheat oven to 350°

Peel pears, cut in half lengthwise and scoop out core. Place, flat-side down, in a small shallow baking dish. Combine brown sugar, lemon juice, and cinnamon. Pour over pears.

Cover and bake 45 minutes, or until pears are tender. Baste occasionally with pan juices while baking.

To serve, place 2 pear halves in each of 4 individual

serving bowls. Spoon pan juices over pears; then top each serving with a dollop of crème sauce. Serve right away. Serves 4.

Chicken 'n Pasta Primavera

1 c diced carrots
1 c broccoli flowerets
2 c cooked pasta
¼ c finely chopped green onion (green part only)
8-oz cooked chicken, cut into cubes or strips
2 tbsp plus 2 tsp reduced-calorie mayonnaise
½ c plain lowfat yogurt
1-oz grated parmesan cheese
? tsp pepper
½ tsp dried basil

Steam carrots and broccoli in a small amount of water until tender-crisp. Drain.

In a large bowl, combine remaining ingredients, mixing well. Add to pasta mixture. Toss to combine.

Chill several hours to blend flavors. Serves 4.
