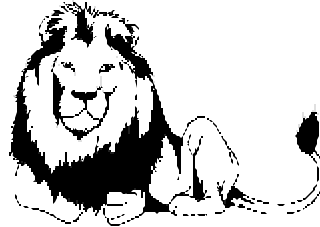

The World's Stupidest Criminals

It was just one of those nights for the burglar who tried to make off with cigarettes from a club in January 1996. He was trying to navigate a cigarette machine out of the foyer of the club in South Marston, England, when he was challenged by a member of staff and forced to flee empty-handed. The barman chased him into the parking lot and rugby-tackled him; then, as they struggled, the raider's panicking accomplice reversed the stolen car over the two men, out onto the main road, and into a ditch. The barman received only minor injuries, but the burglar suffered a broken foot, knee, and thigh.

February 1994 found four bungling burglars ransacking a house near Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, which seems to have belonged to a drug gang. High on drugs themselves, they were searching for a nonexistent stash of gold, cash, and weapons, but then they looked outside and saw two police officers, whose presence was quite coincidental. Recipe of the Month

14-Carat Cake

3 c sifted flour
2 tsp baking powder
1-½ tsp baking soda
1-½ tsp salt
2 tsp cinnamon
2 c sugar
1-½ c salad oil
4 eggs
2 c finely grated carrots
1 (8-½ oz) can crushed pineapple, drained
½ c chopped nuts
1 (3-½ oz) can flaked coconut (optional)
Cream Cheese Frosting

Sift together flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt and cinnamon. Add sugar, salad oil and eggs; mix well. Add carrots, pineapple, nuts and coconut; blend thoroughly. Pour into 3 (9") round layer cake pans that have been greased and floured. Bake in moderate oven (350°) 35 to 40 minutes. Remove from oven, cool a few minutes in pans. Turn out on wire racks and cool thoroughly. Fill layers and frost top and sides of cake with cream cheese frosting. Cake will keep for two to three weeks in refrigerator if covered.

Cream Cheese Frosting

½ c butter or margarine (¼ lb)
1 (8 oz) pkg cream cheese
1 tsp vanilla
1 lb confectioners sugar, sifted if lumpy

Combine butter, cream cheese and vanilla; cream well. Add confectioners sugar gradually, beating well. If mixture is too thick to spread, add a small amount of milk.

Lobster Chowder

6-8 tbs butter
2 small onions, minced
4 medium sized potatoes, diced
4 medium sized lobsters, cooked and picked, or 1 lb lobster meat
2 quarts milk, warmed
salt and pepper to taste

Cook the onion and potato in one cup water in a covered pan until they are tender. Add cooked lobster meat that has been cut into smallish pieces. Add butter. Stir with a fork to mix together and cook about 3 minutes. Warm the milk, then add to the lobster mixture. Season to taste. Allow to mellow. Serves 6 to 8.
