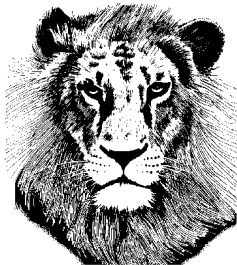

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## World's Stupidest Criminals

David Schidler of Des Moines, Iowa, had no idea that his credit card and birth certificate had been stolen from a storage building in July 1994. Then a customer walked into Schidler's jewelry store, bought \$3,000 worth of jewelry, and handed him his own credit card. At first Schidler thought the man shared the same name as him, but then he recognized his own signature on the card, and his own social security number on the man's driver's license. Police arrested David Cox, who was believed to have used Schidler's birth certificate to obtain the driver's license, and charged him with forgery.

Mark Desautelle's Harley Davidson motorcycle was stolen in May 1992, and he didn't see it again until it passed him on the New Jersey Garden State Parkway the following August. He followed the bike to the town of Nanuet, stopped the rider, and offered to buy the bike for \$10,000 but he insisted on a test drive. The thief agreed, and promptly "test drove" the bike straight to the cops, who arrested Christopher Brown and charged him with possession of stolen property. Police arrested a Brazilian car thief who specialized in stealing luxury BMW's and advertised his trade by distributing calling cards to potential clients declaring his profession to be "thief". Detectives who arrested Robson Augusto do Nascimento Araujo in August 1994

found business cards saying he worked for a fictitious firm called Thefts and Holdups Limited, at 666 Crime Street, Delinquent Gardens> Using the false name Robson Kleber Augusto, he gave his title as "Ladrao," meaning "thief."

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## Recipe of the Month

### Broccoli Salad

1 lb broccoli (peel stems and chop)  
1 small red onion (cut up or chopped)  
1 c raisins

¾ c sunflower seeds

12 oz bacon (cooked and crumbled)

Dressing: (make day before to dissolve sugar)

1 c mayonnaise

2 tbsp red wine vinegar

½ c sugar

Pour dressing on all ingredients and serve.

Shortcuts: You can make dressing the same day and microwave it for a few seconds to dissolve sugar, and instead of cooking bacon you can buy real bacon bits in a jar.

### Chicken'n'Cheese Casserole

(Weight Watchers recipe)

2 c cooked macaroni

2 c coarsely chopped cooked skinless, boneless, chicken breasts

2 c canned condensed cream of mushroom soup (undiluted)

2 c fat-free milk

8 oz low-fat cheddar cheese, cut into small cubes

Preheat oven to 350 F. Combine all ingredients in large casserole, mixing well.

Bake, covered 35-45 minutes. Remove cover, bake 10-15 minutes longer. Serve immediately, serves 6.
