World's Stupidest Criminals

Two prisoners tried to escape from an appearance at a court in Watford, England. Forgetting that they were handcuffed together, they ran on either side of a lamppost. Having hurtled into one another, the stunned pair was grabbed by the guard and bundled into the waiting prison van.

It's not just the bad guys who screw up, of course. In Nowra, New South Wales, Australia, on a Saturday in December 1993, thieves stole a safe containing \$35,000 in cash and scratch-off lottery tickets from a newsstand. It was later found by police, hidden under a nearby building. Nicole Gore, the newsstand's manager, expected the safe to be returned immediately; but the police refused, saying they wanted to keep it under surveillance. Pasta with Light Alfredo Sauce

1 lb fettuccine or linguine, uncooked
1 ½ tbsp butter, melted
3 garlic cloves, pressed
1 ½ tbsp all-purpose flour
2 c skim milk
3 tbsp light cream cheese
½ c (2 oz) grated parmesan cheese
2 tbsp chopped fresh parsley

Cook pasta according to package directions; drain and keep warm. Meanwhile, in large saucepan, melt butter over low heat. Add garlic; cook and stir 30 seconds. Blend in flour; cook and stir 1 minute. Gradually whisk in milk. Cook and stir until mixture comes to a boil and thickens. Remove from heat; stir in cheeses and parsley until cheeses melt. Toss with fettuccine. Yields 6-8 servings.

Sesame Chicken Stir-Fry Salad

Dressing

1/3 c vegetable oil
2 tbsp lemon juice
2 tsp soy sauce
dash of hot pepper sauce

Salad

1 tsp vegetable oil
1 lb boneless, skinless chicken breasts, thinly sliced
1 c thinly sliced carrots
2 garlic cloves, pressed
1 (1 ½ inch) piece gingerroot, peeled and finely chopped or ¼ tsp ground ginger
2 tbsp sesame seeds
1 can (8 oz) pineapple chunks, drained
¼ c sliced green onions
1 pkg (10 oz) fresh spinach leaves

For dressings, whisk all dressing ingredients in small bowl, set aside.

For salad, heat oil in wok or deep-sided 12-inch skillet over medium heat. Add chicken, carrots, garlic, gingerroot and sesame seeds; stir to coat with oil. Stir-fry 4-5 minutes or until chicken is no longer pink in center. On serving platter, arrange pineapple and green onions on top of spinach leaves. Top with chicken mixture; drizzle with dressing. Toss gently. Serves 6.
