Recipe of the Month

Pumpkin-Orange Tart

Pastry for a 10-inch pie or tart (by adding 1 tbsp sugar to pie crust recipe)
? c (4 oz) orange marmalade
1-¾ c (1 lb) pumpkin puree
¾ c (6 oz) sugar
finely grated zest of 1 orange
½ tsp ground cloves
¼ tsp ground ginger
½ tsp ground allspice
½ tsp salt
3 eggs, lightly beaten
1 c (8 oz) heavy (double) cream
orange sabayon cream

On a lightly floured surface, roll out the pastry dough into a 13-inch round. Fit into a 10-inch round fluted tart pan with removable bottom. There should be approximately 1-inch overhang. Fold over the excess dough. Press it against the sides to make them thicker and build them higher than the pan rim by about ½-inch. The shell should be about 1-¼ inches deep to accommodate the filling. Prick the bottom a few times with the tines of a fork. Prepare a double thickness of aluminum foil large enough to line the tart shell generously. Poke a couple holes in it, carefully fit it into the shell and fold the excess over the rim. Refrigerate for 20-30 minutes.

Meanwhile, preheat an oven to 425° F. Place the orange marmalade in a small saucepan over low heat until melted. Set aside.

Remove the pastry shell from the refrigerator and bake for 10 minutes. Remove the foil and continue to bake until lightly golden, another 10-12 minutes. If the bottom puffs up during baking, prick it with a fork. Transfer to a cooling rack. Brush the inside bottom and sides with the melted marmalade. Let cool.

In a bowl stir together the pumpkin, sugar, orange zest, cloves, ginger, allspice and salt. Mix in the eggs and then the cream until smooth. Pour into

the tart shell and smooth the top. Bake for 15 minutes. Reduce the heat to 325° F and bake until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean, about 35 minutes longer.

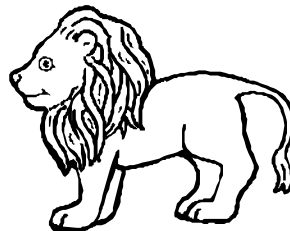
Cool on a wire rack. Remove the pan sides and place the tart on a serving plate. Serve with orange sabayon cream. Serves 8-10.

Ginger or Orange Sabayon Cream

3 egg yolks
¼ c granulated sugar
1 tsp finely grated fresh ginger, or the finely grated zest of 1 orange and 1 tbsp fresh orange juice
1 c (8 oz) heavy (double) cream
1 tbsp confectioners' (icing) sugar

Have ready a pan of ice mixed with a little water. In a heatproof bowl placed over a saucepan of barely simmering water (not touching bowl), whisk together the egg yolks and granulated sugar. Add the ginger or the orange zest and orange juice. Using a whisk or electric mixer, beat until light colored and thickened, 5-6 minutes. Remove the bowl from the heat and nest it in the ice water. Continue whisking until cold. It will get quite thick. Set aside.

In another bowl whip the cream until soft folds form. Add the confectioners' sugar and whip until stiff peaks form. Stir the cream into the egg yolk mixture just until blended and smooth. Cover and refrigerate. Stir well before serving, as it may separate slightly upon sitting. Makes 2-½ to 3 cups. This cream may be made several hours ahead, and leftover sauce can be covered and refrigerated for up to 2 days.

World's Stupidest Criminals

Gloria Smillie, 55 opened the door to find a reformed burglar in his twenties standing on her doorstep in June 1995. Returning to the scene of his crimes in Westcliff, England, the young man said he had found God, apologized to her and handed her a shopping bag containing a silver coffee pot, creamer and sugar bowl. Unfortunately he'd gone to the wrong house; Ms Smillie hadn't been his victim.

Wildlife experts in Wales studying the migratory habits of a salmon with a microchip tagging device attached to it's head were more than a little surprised when it apparently climbed up a riverbank and headed across dry land. The eight-pound fish was resting on a kitchen table with three others when police ar-

rived to arrest Paul Williams, who pleaded guilty to poaching in March 1994.
